News from the board . . .

Ramada and Landscaping

The lawn did well over the summer and Randy Brenckman is working on the fall seeding schedule.

The drinking fountain has been installed near the pool and came in well under budget.

Scheduling people to trim the Palm, Olive, and Sissoo tree has been a difficult process. This year the Palm trees cost \$50 each. Neighbors who did not have their Palms trimmed have caused debris and weeding issues as the seeds blow and root in their neighbors' yards. The City requires Palm trees be trimmed by July 15 of each year. Bev Pettit and Beverly Gasson have agreed to take on the scheduling of Palm tree trimming for 2018.

The Olive and Sissoo tree were trimmed last month at a cost of \$550. Randy is working on getting these trees trimmed on a regular 6 month schedule.

Pool & Spa

Bill Mucci provided the Board with cost proposals to replace the pool and spa heaters. The Board discussed high vs standard efficiency heaters: warranty and operational savings. The Board voted to replace the heaters with standard units.

Historical Commission Update

Craig Sjodin has been attending ongoing meetings with other VM board presidents and the Scottsdale Historic Preservation representatives. The purpose is to condense the rules, eliminate those that don't apply to VM, and modernize for today's world. Steve Venker, Historic Preservation Officer, said they hope to finalize and disseminate the information by the end of September.

VM5-5a resident Regina ("Reggie") Buzzello was appointed by the City Council to the Historic Preservation Commission for 3 years. Reggie believes it is important to have a neighborhood representative on the Commission and invites questions and comments relative to the Historic District from all Villa Monterey homeowners.

What's been happening . . .

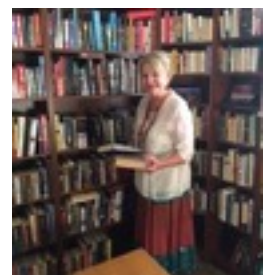
The pool has been getting lots of use this summer. The water aerobic ladies have been getting lots of exercise.

Reminders

New regulations for bulk trash pick-up:

Brush and Bulk Collection
 September 18
 October 16

The city now requires the brush or green waste and household bulk items in separate piles. Two different trucks picking up the items. The piles should not exceed 10 feet long by 6 feet wide by 4 feet tall. Please place the bulk waste and green waste piles at least three feet apart. See the website for more details.

Cell Phone Service



An Arf-ful Reminder

Just a word to our wise canine friends who live in Monterey Park (and to your humans!): Please don't leave any "reminders" on our sidewalks. This is no way to make your mark in the world! A plastic pooch pouch goes a long way toward keeping our walks clean and fresh. And while you are at it, do not make a deposit in anyone's yard. Gravel does not need to be fertilized!

And finally, please observe the age restriction: Canines **under or over** 55 years of age are **not** allowed in the Ramada, the Ramada park, or the pool.

Many of our neighbors have mentioned that cell phone service in Villa Monterey is spotty with dropped calls. In speaking with Verizon, we were told that the block construction of our homes, or a network extender unit (if you or your neighbor has one) is the cause. We were advised by the Verizon store in Costco to use Wi-Fi calling rather than cell line calling. You can select Wi-Fi calling in your settings. You must update your emergency contact address, however, since 911 cannot track you via GPS. When you make a call, your phone will first attempt to use your cell carrier and if that doesn't work, then the call will be made via Wi-Fi. If you are in your car or out and about, then the cell carrier is used. So far it has worked far better without any dropped calls. Another way to get clearer calls if you and the person you are calling has an Apple iPhone is to use FaceTime Audio. In contacts, use the phone receiver icon, not the video camera icon, across from FaceTime. You do not need to have Wi-Fi calling enabled to use FaceTime audio. Amazingly better sound quality.
